




Quantitative Research

Mix mod - CAWI (Computer assisted web interview) + CAPI (Computer assisted personal interview) data collection

Respondents were not aware what would be subject of research going in



N=120

15.02. – 05.03. 2024. Logic and data quality control done on 100% of sample



KEY FINDINGS

- Two thirds of consumers use nicotine pouches due to health-related reasons, mainly to stop smoking.
- More than three quarters of users are not aware of the upcoming ban on nicotine pouches.
- The majority of users would switch to more harmful options, mostly to cigarettes. One in eight consumers expect that pouches will still be available despite the ban on a black market.
- Around two thirds of consumers believe the government should support less harmful alternatives to smoking. Almost three quarters of them agree that nicotine pouches could be helpful in reducing smoking rates in Uzbekistan.
- Almost two thirds of Uzbek consumers support alternative ways of preventing underaged access, primarily through stricter enforcement.
- Uzbek consumers have a very low understanding of the lower risk posed by nicotine pouches: more than half incorrectly believe nicotine pouches are at least as harmful as smoking.





Main reasons for nicotine pouches usage








POUCHES ROLE IN TOBACCO HARM REDUCTION

Around two thirds of consumers believe the government should support less harmful alternatives to smoking. Almost three quarters of them agree that nicotine pouches could be helpful in reducing smoking rates in Uzbekistan.



The German Federal Institute for Risk Assessment (BfR) confirms that nicotine pouches can reduce the health risks compared to smoking. Knowing this information, do you think nicotine pouches can help Uzbekistan reducing the number of smokers in the country?

SUPPORTS FOR ALTERNATIVES TO NICOTINE POUCHES BAN



The main action should be a restriction of sales to minors. Almost two thirds of Uzbek consumers support alternative ways of preventing underaged access, primarily through stricter enforcement.

Supporting of alternatives of nicotine pouches ban





OPINION ON NICOTINE POUCHES BAN



Uzbek consumers have a very low understanding of the lower risk posed by nicotine pouches: more than half incorrectly believe nicotine pouches are at least as harmful as smoking.
